NASHVILLE'S SMALLEST ART GALLERY DEBUTS IN HILLSBORO VILLAGE

New art gallery claims to be smallest in Nashville, perhaps world

This Saturday, March 15th, will mark the grand opening of something small in Nashville. Located in the heart of Hillsboro Village, Nashville's Smallest Art Gallery (NSAG) measures in at a mere 29 inches by 40 inches. In a former life the gallery was a neglected, graffiti-covered glass display case on 21st Avenue between Posh Shoes and Peabody Shoe Repair. Now with the help of some Goo-Gone®, a razor, and a total interior makeover, the gallery has started to take shape. The gallery even features solar-powered lighting, making it the only 100% self-sufficient art gallery in Nashville, and perhaps the world.

The gallery is already attracting some top artists from across the US.

For the opening show, "The Ides of March," three artist will give their take on the grim subject of impending doom. This group show will feature Ferris Plock of San Francisco, Matt Curry of Washington DC, and Nashville's own Rachel Briggs. Each artist is contributing multiple pieces, but none over 5 inches.

The opening will be Saturday March 15th at 7:00 PM. The gallery is located at 1807½ 21st Ave South.
